# Marching Colts Rules \& Policies 


#### Abstract

Attendance All marching band activities are on the band website's calendar, and will be handed out at our commitment meeting in physical form. This should be your main source of information. All notable changes will be communicated as soon as possible.


Members are expected to be at every rehearsal and performance of the Marching Colts. In general, cases of illness (must have a valid doctor's excuse), death in the family or extreme family emergencies are the only excuses that will be accepted for missing a rehearsal or performance. Conflicts with work, other school activities,church and community activities along with routine dental or doctor appointments will not be accepted.

Under most circumstances, an absence from a performance without prior approval will result in dismissal from the organization with no refund of fees paid or at least a regulation to "alternate" status for the remainder of the season. A parent-teacher conference will be requested for any student who accumulates more than two absences from rehearsals.

Late arrivals and early dismissals must also be cleared in advance with Mr. Jorgensen only. Corrective measures will be taken against any members who arrive late to rehearsal. Members will not be excused to leave after halftime performances at football games except in the event of illness or family emergency. Two late arrivals will constitute an absence.

Each member should arrive early for all announced performances and rehearsals. Members should be in place, ready to go, before the call time, not at call time.

Any planned request for a planned absence, late arrival or early dismissal must be submitted in writing at least two days in advance to Mr. Jorgensen. No staff member, instructor, booster or parent can excuse a student for any reason. You must also contact the appropriate staff member or instructor for information purposes only.

It is essential that we have complete student and parental cooperation in this matter. Any absence, regardless of reason, creates a hardship for everyone.

## Rehearsal Attire \& Equipment

## Attire

- T-shirt (NO EXCEPTIONS) - as the weather turns cooler, we will adjust accordingly.
- Athletic Shorts - must be an appropriate length and fit - as the weather turns cooler, we will adjust accordingly.
- Comfortable tennis shoes with socks - sandals, crocs, or flip-flops are NOT ALLOWED during rehearsals.
- Optional - A hat or sunglasses are completely optional.


## Equipment

- Instrument, flag, etc. - ready to go.
- Dot sheets \& music - never assume these will not be needed, even if you have it memorized
- One gallon insulated water jug - labeled with your name
- Hand or bath towel - used to place your instrument on the asphalt or rehearsal lot.

You will be considered tardy if you do not have the appropriate rehearsal attire \& equipment.

## Rehearsal Etiquette

## Talking can make or break rehearsal.

If there is too much talking, things don't get accomplished. You will not hear instructions if you are talking. "How can I rehearse without saying a word?" Of course, sometimes you will need to talk in rehearsal, but if talking is kept to a minimum, things will be completed more efficiently. Ask yourself before you speak, "Will my words help rehearsal?"

## Questions = Answers

If you have a question, raise your hand and a staff member will come to you. It is important not to just yell out questions as this would result in more talking and chaos. A good time to ask questions is when field staff is stating information and when you are asked a question by the staff.

## The value of who is talking.

When the staff is talking to the band, it is imperative that members listen. If a member is talking, they will miss information that could improve the band. Time is wasted. When it is time to give out instructions for what the band is working on, the members must stopwatch they are doing and listen to the instructions being given. Information given to one section may apply to you or your section as well.

## Personal Responsibility

Students must be able to pass off their music and choreography in a timely manner. All music should be memorized by the end of Band Camp! We are only as strong as our weakest member.

Any infraction of disrespect to any part of the organization will result in disciplinary action up to immediate removal from the organization without any refund of fees. You will still be responsible for any fees that you owe up to the point in which you are removed.
